### Things to Bring with You

#### Everyone

- Personal items, towels, and toiletries
- Alarm clock, area rugs, shower curtains, and curtain rings
- Computer with wireless internet card or dongle
- Television and streaming device (Cable/Satellite TV services unavailable on-campus)
- Small trash can and bags
- Broom, mop, and vacuum cleaner
- Air fresheners such as plug-ins, reed diffusers, sprays, and beads
- Posters and pictures, plus painter’s tape and/or command strips for hanging
- Non-abrasive cleaning supplies, toilet brush, plunger
- **\*With prior approval**, you can have service animals, assistance animals, or fish in max 10-gallon tank
- Power strip that includes surge protection to reduce electrical outages (**extension cord not allowed**)

Tips: Please coordinate with your roommate about which items you will share. Assignment emails will include your roommate’s email and name.

### Things to Leave Behind

<b>Everyone</b>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Wireless routers (802.11 MAC address)</li> <li>***Extra furniture</li> <li>Air conditioners or space heaters</li> <li>Weapons or anything resembling a weapon (including firearms in which their owners are not License to Carry (LTC)**** Holders, toy or airsoft gun, large knives and blades longer than 5.5 inches, any device powered by CO2 cartridges, any device that expels any type of projectile, and explosives and ammunition of any type).</li> <li>Unapproved animals</li> <li>Halogen lamps and any plug-in LED/Christmas lights</li> <li>Candles, incense, fireworks, lighters or any other flammable materials</li> <li>Heated elements that could be left unattended for long period of time (such as wickless candles on a heated melter, scented light bulb rings) and which require heat to release scent</li> </ul> <p>***Note: Students may not remove or exchange furniture from common areas of the residence halls or between any residence hall rooms/apartments. There is no storage available for residents to store any university or personal furniture.</p> <p>****Note: For valid LTC holders, you may carry a concealed handgun in all residential communities (Residence Halls and Apartments). License holders residing in campus housing are responsible for the safe storage of their handgun whenever it is not on or about their person. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Appliances such as               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Hot plates, grills, air fryers, toaster ovens</li> <li>Additional microwaves, additional refrigerators of any size, hot air poppers, coffee pots (only Keurig is allowed), waffle/panini makers</li> <li>Anything with an open coil or open flame</li> </ul> </li> <li>Alcohol (regardless of age) and illegal drugs</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Barbecue grills</li> <li>Trampolines, swing sets, basketball goals, etc.</li> <li>Satellite dishes</li> <li>Horse trailers, travel trailers, or boats</li> <li>Lawn mowers and other yard equipment</li> <li>Washer and Dryer</li> <li>Alcohol (if you are under the legal drinking age) and illegal drugs</li> </ul>
